REGULATIONS FOR WORKSHOPS WITH LIMITED PLACES AVAILABLE

ACADEMIC YEAR 2021/22

Considering the workshop format of some courses for the academic year 2020/21 it has been decided to limit the number of places available for students wishing to attend some courses. For each of these workshops we specify below the procedures for selecting the number of attendees:

FIRST SEMESTER WORKSHOPS WEB AND SOCIAL MEDIA WORKSHOP – I SEMESTER

Attendance will be possible for **70 students** regularly enrolled in the 3rd year of the Bachelor's Degree courses in *Comunicazione d'impresa e relazioni pubbliche* (English and Italian curriculum) and *Comunicazione, media e pubblicità*. Actual enrolment will start from the end of the first lesson using a link provided by the Professor so that he can decide the subdivision in groups. In case participants to the course are more than the available places, admission will be granted to the first **70 students in accordance with the order in which the names are entered on the dedicated form.**

Accepted students will be able to add the didactic activities through the study plan online procedure.

PUBLIC SPEAKING WORKSHOP – I SEMESTER

Attendance will be possible for **50 students** regularly enrolled in the 2nd year of the Bachelor's Degree courses in *Comunicazione d'impresa e relazioni pubbliche* (English and Italian curriculum) and in *Comunicazione, media e pubblicità*. Actual enrolment will start from the third lesson using the link provided by the Professor. Admission will be granted in accordance with the order in which the names are entered on the dedicated form. In case participants to the course are more than the available places, admission will be granted to the first **50 students in accordance with the order in which the names are entered on the dedicated form.**

Accepted students will be able to enter the didactic activities through the study plan online procedure.
