LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

B2

English language

To be admitted and attend English-taught courses

B2

Italian language

To be admitted and attend Italian-taught courses

The following certificates are accepted:

- **International language certifications**
- **Official declarations signed by a home-university language teacher**

They must **explicitly** certify the exact level possessed by the student (B2 or higher).

According to the courses they plan to attend, students may have both language certifications (English and Italian), or just one of them.

An **online Nomination Form** will be sent by email to partner universities before the start of each nomination period. All students' language certifications must be uploaded during the Nomination process.

Students will receive instructions to complete their **online Application Form** on the email address indicated during the Nomination process.

Before starting filling in the Application form, students will have to prepare and then upload the following documents:

- **Jpeg photo** (ID/Passport format)
- **PDF of ID card** (for EU students) or **Passport** (for non-EU students)
- **PDF of Academic records in English** (Transcript of Records)
- **PDF of the European Health Card** (EU students) or a **private Health insurance** (non-EU students)

MANDATORY DOCUMENTS

Moving, however temporarily, to a new city is never easy; there are many administrative procedures involved and one can easily get lost among the different steps.

TAX CODE

Mandatory for all students

It's an Italian official identification number used to open bank accounts, have an Italian telephone card, sign a rental contract, etc.

ENTRY VISA

Mandatory for non-EU students

Students not in possession of European citizenship must apply for an entry visa for study purposes at the Italian Embassy or Consulate of their own country.

HEALTH INSURANCE

Mandatory for all students

Students can use their European Health Card or subscribe to a private health insurance.

PERMIT OF STAY

Mandatory for non-EU students

Within 8 days from arrival in Italy, non-EU students must apply for a residence permit at one of the authorized post offices.

ACADEMIC OFFER & INTENSIVE ITALIAN COURSE

Incoming students can select courses from **different degrees** and **different years of study**, according to their language certification, semester of mobility, and some restrictions listed below. Students can attend courses for **up to 30 credits per semester**.

RESTRICTIONS

- To attend some **2nd-year Master's degree courses**, **capped courses** (with limited places available), or **courses with special prerequisites**, students need first confirmation from the Study Abroad Office.
- **Undergraduate incoming students** are admitted to Master's courses only upon acceptance by the Study Abroad Office, except for 1st-year courses from English-taught Master's degrees.
- The **language laboratories** from the Bachelor's and Master's degrees of the Faculty of Interpreting and Translation have specific rules, are held by SSML "Carlo Bo" teachers, and can be selected only by students attending a degree course in foreign languages and translation at their home university.

To help students settle in Milan, we organize an **intensive Italian Language Course** that takes place in September and January/February before the beginning of each semester. The course is intended for students having a **beginner level (A0/A1) of Italian proficiency**. The course requires **compulsory attendance** (at least 80%) as an essential condition for learning success.

After passing the final exam, students will get **6 credits** and a **certificate of attendance**. The course lasts approximately 2/3 weeks before the start of the semester and costs **€ 200**. More information will be sent to nominated students who express their will to participate.

ACCOMMODATION

Incoming students can apply for a place only in our **Residence Santander**, which consists of **20-m2 double rooms** with private bathrooms. All rooms are equipped with 2 single beds, 2 wardrobes, 2 desks, a shelf and satellite TV. On their arrival, students will receive sheets and blankets. In the common areas of the Residence, there are a TV room, a computer room with an Internet connection, and a coin-operated laundry.

The rent is **€ 470/month/person**, to be paid at the beginning of each month, plus a **€ 500 cautionary deposit** to secure the booking. The deposit will be refunded back after departure.

Places are very limited and we usually have a huge number of requests, so getting a room is quite difficult.

STEP 1

Nominated students will receive by email all the instructions to complete the Application Form for their mobility and to apply also for a place in the Residence Santander.

STEP 2

The residence Application Form will be open as follows:

- **1st/Fall semester** = from May 12th to 30th, 2025
- **2nd/Spring semester** = from October 13th to 31st, 2025

STEP 3

Students' applications will be accepted only whether the mobility Application Form is completed correctly. Residence assignees will receive an email from the Study Abroad Office including payment deadlines to confirm their assigned place.


LIFE IN MILAN



Can students take courses belonging to Bachelor's or Master's degrees different to their Major at home university?

We always suggest to firstly stick to degrees similar to their study path in their university. If needed, students can also select courses from other degrees, paying attention to the column of Restrictions in our Course Catalogue.

Can students take IULM exams online or at their university?

IULM exams are taken entirely in presence during the three exam sessions scheduled in the academic year. Students are tested face to face, orally or by written tests.

Can students do an internship during their mobility?

Only during their mobility, students can benefit from the help of IULM Career Service to find an internship in Milan. They can obtain 3 credits from the internship. Please note that finding an internship for incoming students can be challenging, especially if they don't master Italian language.

When will classes' timetables & exam schedules be published?

Classes' timetables are usually published some weeks before the start of the semester, while exam schedules are published around one and a half month before each exam session.
