In September 2015, the Governments of the 193 UN member states adopted the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. The Agenda sets out 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) comprising an integrated, universal action plan aimed at promoting peace, prosperity and sustainable development for our planet and its people.

Università IULM, including the entire university community, is committed to meeting this urgent call to action and, as already indicated in the University Strategic Plan 2022–2024 "Contributing to social participation and continuous development means for IULM University to be able to speak also to its local region and civil society – without ever forgetting the specificities of the academic institution. 
Partnership for the goals



The current challenges facing the international community are too complex for any sector of society to resolve on its own. This is why SDG 17 affirms that the SDGs can only be realized with **strong global partnerships and cooperation**.

IULM's commitment to partnership with the widest cross-section of stakeholders across society is the driving force behind the university's mission and the cornerstone of its educational policy.

IULM also embraces the mission of fulfilling its responsibilities towards citizen education and the **socio-cultural development of the community**. This objective is pursued with a vision of cultural democracy, seeking to expand opportunities for interaction, dialogue, and knowledge-sharing across a diverse audience. To advance this commitment, the recently established **IULM Sustainability Committee**, led by the Rector's Proxy to Sustainability and Social Responsibility, aims to promote initiatives for listening, engagement, and education on sustainability within the IULM community (including faculty, staff, and students). Additionally, the committee endeavors to enhance existing activities and initiatives undertaken by individuals within the IULM community, collaborate on sustainability reporting, and drive initiatives for recycling, reducing energy and material consumption, as well as advocating for sustainable mobility.

Global Projects

- Italy France monitoring centre: aimed at fostering a comparative dialogue on key cultural sectors, IULM collaborates with Sorbonne Nouvelle in Paris, to present a series of events delving into strategies, practices, and dynamics within the cultural industries of both countries;
- KIC: the Knowledge & Innovation Community (KIC) assesses SDGs-related data for the European innovation system. With extensive expertise in the economics of cultural & creative industries, IULM has been a key player in this project;

IULM believes that knowledge and innovation are not linked to mere geographical boundaries and that the complexity of international challenges makes it increasingly necessary to connect and create global synergies and share best practices.

YOUMAN Platform

The IULM **YouMan Platform** brings together international cooperation agreements and initiatives established by Università IULM with NGOs, multilateral organizations, associations, businesses, and research centers worldwide. It places a strong emphasis on social values, alongside aspects of innovation and sustainability.

- **FAO Cooperation Agreement:** FAO collaborates with IULM, in alignment with the university's global initiatives on food awareness and food security, to advance efforts in promoting sustainable food practices.
- Inclusive University Manifesto: this is an initiative promoted by the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), with the aim of facilitating refugees' access to university education and research, and promoting their social integration and active participation in academic life.
- Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainable Development: the UN has declared 2021-2030 the "Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainable Development." The Manifesto for this initiative mobilizes global stakeholders for a paradigm shift in ocean study and communication. IULM's involvement focuses on education, including talks, summer schools, and events promoting ocean literacy and sustainability.
- **FISU Healthy Campus**: is an initiative by the International University Sports Federation (FISU) promoting well-being through sports. IULM's participation offers opportunities for sharing best practices, organizing sports tournaments and joining FISU events. This initiative aligns with the Sustainable Development Goals.
- Moleskine Foundation: this is a non-profit organization that teamed up with IULM to empower young people and their communities for positive social impact. This project is designed for individuals aged 18 to 27 who are fluent in African dialects. They will receive training in writing and promoting African culture, history, language, and communities, preserving this valuable heritage.
- **Mygrants**: a for-profit digital company aimed at supporting immigrants in their social integration. It provides information, training and job placement to immigrants.

Gender Equality

Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls

With approximately **79% of its student body being female**, Università IULM places a strong emphasis on the fifth Sustainable Development Goal - Gender Equality - as a cornerstone of its mission.

Università IULM has long been dedicated to the pursuit of gender equality. The university champions various initiatives and projects aimed at supporting women throughout their entire academic journey, from the admission process to graduation, with the aim of establishing the groundwork for a successful career. IULM also supports women employees in their career progression and ensures a widespread gender equality culture.

In this regard, the University Board adopted in 2021 the **Gender Equality Plan**, which emphasizes the advancement of female students' and employees' learning and professional experiences as a central focus. Additionally, it discloses precious information about the progress made by the university in terms of the gender breakdown of the student and empolyee community.

IULM encourages women and girls to advance in academia by giving them equitable access to education.

The Equal Opportunities Committee

The **Equal Opportunities Committee** is a joint body representing teaching staff, technical-administrative staff and the student community, whose objective is to advance and provide equitable opportunities within the university community, and enhancing the well-being of those who work and study there.

Additionally, it seeks to fight all sorts of prejudice based on factors such as gender identity, ethnicity, political views, sexual orientation, age, and others. It also offers support to people who perceive themselves to be the victims of discrimination.

Gender Equality Plan

The Committee organizes a wide range of activities, spanning from cultural events promoting the underlying principles of equal opportunities, to increasing awareness on topics such as gender equality. Additionally, it is responsible for drafting the **Gender Equality Plan**. This document outlines the strategies adopted by the University to promote, support, and implement gender equality in various domains. The biennial plan provides a comprehensive overview of the diverse areas in which IULM actively works to ensure that gender equality is effectively upheld.

The purposes and strategies implemented, in fact, while not limited to the academic environment, place particular importance on achieving and maintaining gender equality in such a context. The belief that equal access to education and research, indeed, is a fundamental cornerstone of IULM, besides being a prerequisite for a professional and personal condition that makes no distinction by gender.

IULM Services

Counseling program

Among the top services available to the student population at the university, IULM offers various mentoring and **Counseling programs** that guide both female and male students through different phases of their university life. Throughout the academic year 2021/2022, a range of psychological support formats were provided based on the individual needs of each student.

Seminars

Seminars and group meetings have addressed issues related to mental health and well-being. Thanks to the versatility and adaptability of the topics discussed to the emotional experiences of most students, this format has been remarkably successful, especially among the female population at IULM, who felt a strong connection to these issues, reaching 94% of the total participants.

Group meetings

The "Orienta-menti" sessions, namely "Failure, I'm not afraid of you", "Ready to Answer", and "Flexibly", were specialized meetings tailored for smaller groups of students. Their purpose was to educate students on effective stress management and how to approach challenges and failures in a constructive way. These initiatives were met with great enthusiasm by female students at IULM, with women making up 80% of the total participants.

Individual sessions

The most personalized and tailored approach was provided through individual sessions with professional psychologists, designed to address and resolve more specific personal issues. The results underscored the university's commitment to women, with nearly 74% of the program participants being female students.

Scholarships

The university supports and promotes access to education for women from an economic standpoint. In the academic year 2021/2022, **81% of scholarships were awarded to deserving female students** facing financial hardship.

IULM Projects for Gender Equality

FA-ST Promote Female Startups in STEM

FA-ST is a priority IULM project, co-funded by the Erasmus+ Programme of the European Union, **dedicated to young women**: it is an innovative project characterized by the cross-fertilization between creativity and algorithms to support women in the **creation of their own start-up in STEM**, thus reducing unemployment among them and facilitating their participation in subjects, areas and disciplines where women are underrepresented.

This program centers on people, making them the focal point of the learning journey. It's about shifting the usual habits and priorities. It encourages personal growth, understanding social issues, and a strong commitment to making a positive impact. Students can put these new values into action in tasks like communication projects, work experiences, and research on ethical topics.

"Feminine Cinema Award"

Given the underrepresentation that women typically face in the film industry, Università IULM is spearheading the inaugural edition of the **Feminine Cinema Awards**. This initiative aims to envision a cinematic and audiovisual landscape enriched by an increasing presence of female voices.



The award, carried out in partnership with Società Umanitaria, seeks to celebrate the **talent of women in the field of screenwriting**, with the hope that these voices will continue to gain authority and influence. Through this endeavor, Università IULM aspires to foster a more inclusive and diverse cinematic sphere, ultimately amplifying the impact and significance of women's contributions to the world of storytelling through film.

Events and initiatives

"Afghanistan, what now?"

The well-known gender apartheid that has impacted women in Afghanistan since the Taliban came to power has prompted Università IULM to commit more than ever to raise public awareness and enlighten minds on sensitive issues such as gender parity and the presence of women in higher education.

In order to ensure that the situation of Afghan women does not fade into silence, six months after the fall of Kabul, the university arranged a roundtable discussion on the occasion of March 8th, the International Women's Day. This event was dedicated to addressing this sensitive issue.

Throughout the roundtable several experts from Afghanistan and the Middle East have participated, but most importantly, there was the invaluable firsthand account of three Afghan IULM students: Shabaneh Ganji, Najima Yawari, and Rahila Saya. Their powerful testimonies added a unique and meaningful dimension to this event.

Conference "Bilancio di Genere e Gender Equality Gap: prospettive future"

To further discuss improvements and future prospects for gender equality, professors from the most prominent universities in Milan, including IULM, engaged in a dialogue on the subject in the presence of the Minister for Equal Opportunities, Elena Bonetti.

International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women

Università IULM marks the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women with a screening of the film "La scuola cattolica," directed by Stefano Mordini in 2021. This film, which premiered at the Venice Film Festival, is based on Edoardo Albinati's novel and draws from a tragic 1975 event known as the "Circeo Murder", during which two very young women were tragically murdered.

Four inspirational women by four professors

The value of women. Four female professors from the university have selected equally deserving women, ranging from pioneers in labor organization studies to directors and visual artists. They recount their accomplishments and their impact on society, emphasizing the importance of recognizing and celebrating the contributions that women make to contemporary culture.

Sguardi Altrove International Women's Film Festival

The International Women's Festival "Sguardi Altrove" celebrates female cinematic creativity and this year marks its 29th edition. Università IULM, always committed promoting inclusivity of female voices audiovisual industry, the collaborated with students from the Master's program in Specialized Translation Conference and Interpreting, who were responsible for creating the subtitles.

Reduce inequality within and among countries

Università IULM stands as committed advocate against any barriers that breed division. The university believes that every individual has an unassailable right to the same opportunities, the same education, and the same chances at success. Dismantling inequalities isn't just a priority – it's an imperative, a duty IULM holds sacred to create a world where all voices are heard, and all paths are open.

Among the main policies and initiatives promoted by the university, IULM counts the **Code of Ethics** and the **Equal Opportunity Committee** which set the ground rules for a zero-tolerance approach towards any kind of discrimination. The university also undertakes more direct actions, supporting its students through the counseling and tutoring programs especially dedicated to minorities and underrepresented groups.

At the heart of the **Code of Ethics** there are three core principles: upholding fairness and justice, demonstrating respect for others, and accepting personal and professional responsibility.

The university's effort to combat inequalities takes shape in the form of the **Equal Opportunities Committee**, a joint body represented by faculty, administrative staff, and students. Its aim is to counteract any form of discrimination by promoting and safeguarding equal opportunities within the university community.

To ensure the unwavering adherence to this principle, two pivotal figures take the lead: the **Rector's Proxy for Inclusion and Disability**, and the **Rector's Proxy for Equal Opportunities**.

In our university community, we champion inclusivity, rejecting all forms of discrimination, whether based on age, race, religion, or orientation.

DiversaMENTE office

Università IULM has long been an advocate for the culture of integration through the diligent and ongoing efforts of the **DiversaMENTE office**. This office is the dedicated department in charge of providing **support for students with disabilities and Specific Learning Disorders (SLD)** throughout their entire university journey, from the admission process all the way through to graduation.

With the goal of ensuring that every student has equal access to education and culture, the DiversaMENTE Office is committed to providing daily support to these students. This is achieved through the implementation of a **personalized approach** tailored to the specific needs of each individual.

Among the **main services** offered by DiversaMENTE:

- **Guidance and support service for admission**, both during the admission test and for the incoming freshmen orientation;
- Assistance with administrative procedures;
- **Support for study**, through technological aids, didactic support through Peer Tutors, courses on study methods and Erasmus+ program that allocate funds specifically for the mobility of individuals with special needs;
- **Job placement**, both regarding an internship experience while being students and a placement opportunity for their work life as graduates;
- **Psychological support** through the Counseling Services, in the form of individual interviews with professional psychologists.
- Fees and financial benefits, either through a tuition exemption or different scholarships.
- Barrier-free Campus, the campus is provided with accessible entrances, toilets, lifts, car parking, barrier-free routes all around the campus. In classrooms and in the library there are spaces for people using wheelchairs and there are especially adapted accommodations in the on-campus housing. IULM supports blind and seeing-impaired students with mobility orientation courses.

The **fundamental guide for incoming IULM students** provides a wide range of information and contact details for further assistance regarding accommodations, learning difficulties, and disabilities. There is a specific emphasis on the disabilities section, which outlines various supports available based on different disabilities, along with policies, support services, and accommodations for disabled students. It's worth noting that within IULM Residence, there are four housing units exclusively reserved for students with motor disabilities. Additionally, IULM offers financial support to students with disabilities.

Euresis Center for Diagnosis, Intervention, DSA Research.

IULM's DiversaMENTE office works closley with the university **research center Euresis** which is specializes in **diagnostics and training for students with SLD**. In fact it provides access to cutting-edge diagnostic tools and experienced professionals. The center aims to bridge the gap between clinical assessment and tailored learning strategies for each individual.

Inclusive University Manifesto

The **Inclusive University Manifesto** is an initiative promoted by the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), with the aim of facilitating refugees' access to university education and research, and promoting their social integration and active participation in academic life.

This initiative outlines fundamental principles and commitments for universities to **enhance support for refugee students**.

Adhering to this Manifesto formalizes University's dedication to social integration and inclusion, particularly for students with international protection status, ensuring their active participation in academic life.

IULM In-Zone Project

Starting from autumn 2022, Università IULM has been taking part in the **training project for students living in the Azraq refugee camp** (Jordan) and **Kakuma refugee camp** (Kenya), in collaboration with the University of Geneva. The project team has set up an actual campus and continues to develop targeted teaching, meeting the needs of the students, with courses both in-person and by distance learning. IULM contributes to the project with 2 30h online courses on the basis of communication that can be further developed in more structured subsequent courses.

The expected outcomes of the InZone programme can be summarized as follows:

- Direct cognitive (knowledge and skills) and academic (credits, data and ideas) impact: Critical thinking, learning skills, curiosity, innovative thinking, contributing to the discovery of knowledge, developing the capacity to follow long-course degree programmes (as a bridge to higher education scholarships)
- **Economic impact**: access to jobs (voluntary positions within the camps and/or long-term solutions outside the camps), running one's own business, setting up SMEs etc.
- **Enhancement of individual resilience**: confidence and self-esteem, hope for the future, planning ahead and overcoming future challenges, social ties and the feeling of being useful and connected to others, making their own decisions and acting independently, both as individuals and as a community.
- Impact on the role and image of refugees in the camps and host communities (empowerment): The ability to make oneself heard and to engage in collective decisions, leadership abilities.
- **Sustainable development and communities**: meeting community needs, creating community-based projects and/or organizations, social and technical innovation etc.

Scholarships and financial benefits

For Ukrainian students

In light of the situation arising from the Russo-Ukrainian conflict, IULM has implemented the following measures: a reduction in tuition fees for Ukrainian students and an extension of the deadline for the third installment payment.

For International Protection Holders

Università IULM participates in the initiative promoted by the Ministry of the Interior and CRUI, providing scholarships to students with refugee or subsidiary protection status.

Invest your talent in Italy

In its seventh edition, the "**Invest your Talent in Italy**" program, supported by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation, offers scholarships, university fee waivers, assistance services, and additional benefits to selected international students. These students have the chance to participate in a high-level training program at esteemed Italian universities, coupled with an internship at an Italian company.

IULM's **Statute** is the essential institutional document that elaborates in the policies and guiding directives of the academic institution. This statute unequivocally embodies the university's tireless commitment to promoting transparent and democratic governance, emphasizing its constant dedication to these fundamental values.

The internal policy framework in place fosters democratic processes, provided through different bodies:

- **Governing Board Representation**: include representatives of students, as well as both faculty and non-faculty staff members.
- **Students' Union Empowerment**: students shape the university's policies and regulations through full participation and representation rights across all governing, academic and administrative bodies.
- Academic Freedom and Autonomy: it grants faculty and researchers the autonomy to choose research areas and openly engage in teaching and discussion within their respective fields. This commitment aligns with the principles of the Italian Constitution and relevant legal frameworks, including those established by the European Union.
- **Stakeholder Engagement**: IULM prioritizes involving external stakeholders in decision-making processes, through the Board of Directors, the university's top governing body. This structure encourages active participation from the local community, civil society leaders, and representatives of the national government. Additionally, the establishment of **MondolULM association** provides a dedicated platform for engaging a diverse range of external stakeholders in various aspects of university life, reinforcing the institution's connections with the wider community it serves.

Principles and commitment on organized crime, corruption & bribery

The official policy, "Modello di organizzazione gestione e controllo", expressly forbids fraud and bribery. It also outlines Università IULM's core principles and steadfast commitments against organized crime, corruption, and bribery.

The institution recognizes that the future of cities relies on responsible urban development and active community engagement. IULM integrates sustainability principles into its academic programs, research initiatives, and campus operations. Through innovative courses, research projects, and partnerships, the university equips students with the knowledge and skills needed to address urban challenges, from environmental conservation to social inclusivity. Furthermore, IULM actively participates in local community initiatives, advocating for sustainable urban planning and collaborating with local organizations to create a more environmentally conscious and inclusive city. In these ways, Università IULM demonstrates a steadfast dedication to building a more sustainable, resilient, and vibrant urban environment for all.

IULM also provides full access to the Milanese community and the general public to all of its buildings and facilities. In this context it should be noted that the university has significantly contributed to the beautification and landscaping of its location and surrounding community.



Contribution to Arts and Heritage

Exhibitions and works of art

IULM frequently organizes for the public, and the Milanese community exhibitions and gallery whether on artistic, other cultural or socio-political theme in the context of sustainablility and communication. Below are some examples of 2022:

- "The Multiverse Game": an interactive exhibition organized by IULM's students;
- "The Extraordinary Stories of Palmira": a photographic exhibition in collaboration with the Terra Santa Foundation, focusing on archaeological communication;
- "Contatti Tenaglia" (1970): a bronze sculpture by artist Giò Pomodoro was inaugurated at IULM Campus and is now accessible to the general public.

Cinema

Julm Movie Lab

IULM Movie LAB is a cutting-edge audiovisual production hub and a breeding ground for innovative concepts. It serves as a vital link between the corporate realm and the narrative requirements of businesses, spanning from developing advertising ideas to creating comprehensive corporate films. It operates across three distinct realms: television, cinema, and new media.

One of its main projects is **Diritti Lab**, the result of a collaboration between Università IULM and the Farnesina, aimed at eliminating any form of discrimination. The projects features thirteen films created by talented young graduates and current students of IULM, delving into the realms of human rights and essential, unassailable freedoms.

Live performances

University Theatre Centre (CUT)

The University Theatre Centre (CUT) is a hub for socializing and amateur performing arts, as well as a center for artistic practice. It places a strong emphasis on enhancing individual and community value, as well as promoting teamwork. The focus is on developing both verbal and non-verbal soft skills essential for the educational growth of young individuals. This is achieved through workshops led by artists and industry experts. The CUT organizes several performances every year, below a few examples from 2022:

- Gaber's show "Polli d'allevamento";
- Ghiaccio Shackleton's legendary expedition to the South Pole.

IULM Choir

THE **IULM choir** is open to all students, teachers, staff and collaborators and every year it organizes several outstanding performances open to the general public.

Cultural heritage

Heritage Lab

The Heritage Lab, a collaboration with Manageritalia, is the university inaugural project lab involving over 60 students, three managers, and overseen by faculty. It focused on a pilot project centered around the Sacred Mountain of Varese, one of Italy's nine Sacred Mountains. The goal was to devise fresh approaches to managing Italian cultural heritage.

Moleskine Foundation

The Moleskine Foundation, a non-profit organization, teamed up with IULM to empower young people and their communities for positive social impact. This project is designed for individuals aged 18 to 27 who are fluent in African dialects. IULM is actively involved in significant **archaeological ventures**, valued not only for their artistic worth, but primarily for their historical testimonies, such as:

- Underwater excavations at Baia Castle
- excavation campaign in the Andes, Peru

Sustainable cities

Green areas for the community

IULM inaugurated the new "Silvio Federico Baridon" Garden, founder of IULM together with Carlo Bo, a **10,000 square metre green area** returned to the city community following the redevelopment and enhancement works carried out in 2019. It is a green lung in the southern area of Milan equipped with workout machines, a field of soccer field made of synthetic grass, a playground area also accessible to children with disabilities, a section reserved for dogs and a gathering space with benches and tables sheltered by a pergola and thus **usable in all seasons by the general public**.

IULM is committed to **pedestrian priority** throughout the campus. In fact IULM has taken over and **redeveloped a new pedestrian area** in Via Carlo Bo (the university's main thoroughfare) and the related green areas of about 4285 square meters. This important initiative promoting pedestrian priority has also resulted in a **21% increase in the green area** of the Campus overall.

Sustainable Mobility

To promote **sustainable mobility**, Università IULM has forged several partnerships:

- Through an agreement with the ENI Group, IULM students enjoy preferential rates for the Enjoy vehicle sharing service.
- A collaboration with Zig Zag, a free-floating scooter sharing service, extends special benefits to IULM students.
- A partnership with Trenitalia, discounted train fares are available for the IULM community.

IULM sustainable building projects

Cascina Moncucco

Cascina Moncucco, a seventeenth-century farmstead in Milan, underwent a remarkable transformation, becoming a shining example of sustainable building standards and energy efficiency. This historical gem had long been neglected, but in 2017, Università IULM, with support from various institutions, embarked on a comprehensive renovation project. This endeavor not only breathed new life into Cascina Moncucco but also turned it into a residence for 100 young people and a cultural center for the city. The renovation project achieved Silver level certification with the LEED Italia 2009 NC system, signifying a deep commitment to environmental sustainability and energy conservation. The emphasis on energy efficiency was evident in improved insulation and efficient systems, while the building excelled in water conservation, boasting low-flow equipment in the toilets and a rainwater collection system for irrigation. Cascina Moncucco's success story serves as a pioneering model for similar initiatives, demonstrating how the restoration of historical treasures can go hand in hand with a greener, more energy-efficient future, all while preserving the past.

Fabbrica di Quartiere

Fabbrica di Quartiere, an innovative and interdisciplinary project, aims to rejuvenate the Southeast quadrant of Milan. Spearheaded by Politecnico di Milano and Università IULM, this initiative involves a collaborative effort with local businesses and public and private institutions. The project seeks to empower Southeast Milan neighborhoods, overcome peripherality, and foster meaningful change by addressing the area's multicultural populations, neighborhood structures, repurposing of disused areas, and local enterprises. It envisions a future where concrete, feasible, and sustainable projects enhance open spaces along public transportation routes, create an ecological network, and foster cultural programs for the communities of Calvairate and Rogoredo.

In each of these projects, the focus on reimagining the use of public spaces aligns with the interests of partner companies, actively engaged in a collaborative dialogue with the local community. Fabbrica di Quartiere, led by a dedicated team from Politecnico di Milano and Università IULM, reflects a collective effort to foster sustainability, innovation, and community enhancement in the vibrant Southeast Milan neighborhoods.

URBINAT

The **URBiNAT project** is dedicated to revitalizing and harmonizing urban peripheries, particularly in public housing neighborhoods across various European and non-European cities. It achieves this by implementing innovative **Nature-Based Solutions to ensure sustainability** and by engaging local communities to foster social cohesion. Emphasizing the transformation of public spaces, the project aims to forge novel urban, social, and natural bonds within and between neighborhoods, in collaboration with the residents. URBiNAT's central objective is the holistic well-being of its inhabitants, manifested through the co-creation of what is known as the "Healthy corridor," an assembly of pioneering Nature-Based Solutions, nurtured through participatory processes involving local communities.

Cities participating in the project are categorized as Front runner cities (such as Porto, Nantes, and Sofia) and follower cities (including Siena, Nova Gorica, Brussels, and Høje-Taastrup), each at varying stages of implementing these innovative solutions. Front runner cities have already conducted local context analyses and are actively crafting urban plans for realizing the Healthy corridor, even amidst challenges posed by the Covid-19 pandemic. Follower cities are currently in the process of studying and adopting best practices gleaned from the experiences of the Front runner cities. Recent technical meetings among project partners, held in Siena, allowed for the presentation of progress in partner cities and introduced local teams, citizens, and public and private associations actively engaged in developing a strategic plan for urban greenery promotion, a goal to be realized through the URBiNAT project. Over the next three years, the project will further develop Nature-Based Solutions and assess their impact within the urban context. Università IULM, apart from overseeing the study of local contexts, leads the URBiNAT Observatory Work Package, responsible for monitoring and analyzing project activities. The digital platform for the Observatory is currently undergoing testing, which will facilitate the collection and utilization of data from cities for analysis, evaluation, and publication of noteworthy results via the project's website.





No Discrimination

IULM Equal Opportunities Committee is a high-level university joint body representing teaching staff, technical-administrative staff & the student community aimed at promoting & guaranteeing equal opportunities in the university community. It aims at countering all forms of discrimination & harassment based on gender identity, ethnicity, political thought, sexual orientation, age.

As stated in the **IULM Code of Ethics**, IULM's community must act ethically according to 3 fundamental principles: fairness and justice, respect for others, personal and professional responsibility. Violence and aggressions, both physical and verbal and any form of abuse are unacceptable because they undermine the dignity and rights of the person. IULM will not tolerate any form of harassment, violence, abuse of sexual nature. Art. 4 lists the forms of sexual harassment that include physical contact, unwanted attention, verbal harassment of a sexual nature.

Gender Equality Plan

IULM's **Gender Equality Plan** (GEP) serves as a vital tool for articulating and disseminating the University's strategy to advance gender balance. It forms an integral part of a broader strategic framework dedicated to fostering equal opportunities within the institution. The GEP also incorporates a gender perspective into all internal policies and actively engages in cultural, educational, and research initiatives to raise awareness among the university community (including students, teaching and research staff, and administrative personnel) as well as the broader public.

Recognition of unions & labour rights

End poverty in all its forms everywhere

Recognizing the critical importance of **eradicating poverty** for sustainable global development, IULM is committed to alleviating economic hardship and promoting inclusive prosperity.

To do so, it has implemented a range of initiatives and **financial aid programs** that include regional scholarships reimbursement of enrollement fees and university contributions.

IULM also provides **extraordinary grants** in cases where the student has found him/herself in serious family financial situations, with loss of disposable income; in cases of illness, accidents, surgery and/or costly rehabilitation treatment, which have affected the student or family members and compromised the student's academic career; death of a member of the family, responsible for the student's maintenance. These extraordinary grants enable students to complete their university programme.

Empowering through quality education is not just beneficial, but essential for the whole community. By reducing poverty, Università IULM paves the way for better, more dignified living conditions for everyone.

Financial support

"Rate 0"

IULM grants a **special tuition rate** called "**Rate 0**" to those who fall into the bottom 20% of household income group: these students have a university ISEE value under € 5,000 (ISEE stands for Equivalent Economic Situation Indicator and is a measure of a family's financial status in Italy). In addition, IULM applies differentiated tuition rates in accordance with the five different income levels.

Scholarships and financial benefits

IULM offers University Scholarships and financial incentives to low-income students. Among them:

- Invest in your future: bank loan;
- **Scholarship for International Students**: up to 100% reduction on the tuition fee for the 20 most deserving students and accommodation at reduced rate;
- Scholarships for International protection holders;
- **Invest Your Talent in Italy**: scholarships, tuition waivers, support services and other benefits to international students.

Catering at a reduced rate

Università IULM grants the **catering service at a reduced rate** at the campus canteen to students enrolled who meet the necessary income requirements (university ISEE). The service includes a complete meal which is made up, according to the universal standards that determine the average requirements of an adult, of a first course, a second course, side dish and bread, or an equivalent meal.

Housing at favorable conditions

Università IULM grants **residence at favourable conditions** for students who meet the necessary income requirements.

Study grants for 150 working hours

For students who can effectively juggle their studies and work commitments, IULM provides the chance to earn through **collaborations with various University offices**. It's a great way to enhance the students' resume with an experience that doesn't surpass 150 hours per academic year.

Financial support to Ukrainian students

The university has also allocated special funds for Covid-19 and for Ukrainian students. In particular:

- reduction of enrolment fees;
- extension to July 2022 of the deadline for payment of the third instalment of university fees and contributions.

Università IULM is deeply committed to **fostering innovation and entrepreneurship** through its unwavering **support for start-ups**. With a strong belief in the transformative power of new ideas and entrepreneurial endeavors, the university provides a dynamic ecosystem that encourages students, alumni, and the broader community to embark on their entrepreneurial journeys. Università IULM nurtures the growth of start-ups, offering mentorship, access to funding, co-working spaces, and a network of experts and industry connections.

IULM Pitch Day

Nearly 120 IULM students are involved in the development of 20 startups! These projects, presented during the #IULMPitchDay on May 24th, focus on innovative ideas within the realms of tourism and cultural industries.

The jury, consisting of entrepreneurs, managers, investors, and IULM professors, assessed the potential of the startups and selected the top three projects.

Booster: Business, Communication and Strategic Analysis Training for Entrepreneurship

This IULM project supports selected startups in the Berkeley SkyDeck Europe program, enhancing their **entrepreneurial skills** through training, mentoring, and networking. It aims to strengthen connections between startups, markets, and universities while promoting knowledge sharing on innovation and technology ventures. The focus areas include Entrepreneurship, Marketing & Communication, Business Technology, and Business Analytics, aligning with IULM's interdisciplinary approach.

Berkeley SkyDeck will select up to **12 startups**, offering them a chance to engage with one of the top **accelerators** in Silicon Valley and participate in a 6-month acceleration program. Following this, the project leverages the skills, labs, and networks of the chosen universities through a grant promoted by Fondazione Cariplo.

The startups chosen for the acceleration program also have the opportunity to **receive a €145,000 investment** from the private investment fund established by Lendlease. Additionally, they have the chance to pitch their project to an international network of investors during the final Demo Day.

Work Placement

GIG UP

The IULM GIG Up project is tailored for young workers without a completed university education. It aims to enhance their entrepreneurial spirit and professional skills, especially considering the atypical nature of their employment contracts. Many of these young workers may not be adequately prepared for this unique type of work. The project offers a series of targeted micro-courses designed to equip them with the skills needed to thrive in the business world, reducing unemployment.

Mygrants

Mygrants is a for-profit digital company - and one of the main partners of IULM - aimed at supporting immigrants in their social integration. Through adaptive micro-learning and thematic quizzes, it provides information, training and job placement to immigrants, reducing precarious situations unemployment. The aim is to turn the phenomenon of migration into a significant social and economic opportunity.

1. Behaviour & Brain Lab

Established in 2010 at Università IULM and initially conceived as a center for behavioral analysis and biofeedback research, it has progressively integrated state-of-the-art **neurophysiological analysis techniques**. Today, it stands as one of the most distinguished hubs in Italy for applying **neuroscience and artificial intelligence analyses to marketing**. The research center's primary aim is to measure consumer emotions, perceptions, and overall experiences.

Brain Lab at Dubai Expo 2020: the Behavior and Brain Lab IULM participated in Expo Dubai at the Italy Pavilion, showcasing and explaining the potential of neuroscience in the field of aesthetics and, more broadly, in all contexts related to tourism and business dynamics.

2. IULM AI Lab

The IULM AI Lab is an advanced research laboratory and innovation hub dedicated to conceiving, producing, developing, and disseminating **solutions** and services based on Artificial Intelligence. RUS

CESTOur

Università IULM is a partner in the Erasmus+ project "Centers of Excellence in **Sustainable Tourism** to boost **economic development** and enhance University-Business cooperation in Southern Asia – CESTour". This project aims at:

- promoting sustainable tourism concepts in the tourism sector in India, Nepal, and Sri Lanka;
- **enhancing university-business cooperation** in the tourism sector to promote sustainable tourism development values;

Urbinat

The URBiNAT project focuses on the **regeneration and integration of low-income urban peripheries** in various cities, through a strategy of interventions known as **"Nature Based Solution"**, which ensures sustainability and mobilizes local resources for social cohesion. Università IULM, in addition to being the lead partner responsible for the study of local contexts, coordinates the Work Package dedicated to the URBiNAT Observatory, which aims to monitor and analyze the project's activities.

Fabbrica di Quartiere Cascina Moncucco

In collaboration with the Politecnico di Milano. this innovative. multidisciplinary project seeks to rejuvenate neighborhoods in the Southeast quadrant of Milan, aligning them with the sustainable building standards. Beginning at the grassroots level, it involves research, the formulation of strategies, and potential interventions in these areas. The ultimate aim is to mobilize resources and address issues of peripherality and marginalization.

Università IULM's restoration project of seventeenth-century the Cascina achieved Moncucco Silver level certification with the LEED Italia 2009 NC system, signifying a deep commitment to environmental sustainability and **energy conservation**. The emphasis on efficiency evident energy was efficient improved insulation and systems, while the building excelled in water conservation, boasting low-flow equipment in the toilets and a rainwater collection system for irrigation.

Green areas at IULM

IULM is taking care of a new pedestrian area on Via Carlo Bo and its associated **green spaces**, totaling approximately **4285 square meters**. This has led to a 21% increase in cared-for green areas, marking a significant stride toward making the campus greener and enhancing the adjacent neighborhood with gardens and pedestrian areas for students and the entire city of Milan to enjoy.

Events

Dr. Stefania Divertito, spokesperson for the Minister of Ecological Transition, shared how the 2018 climate strike led by the Fridays for Future movement spurred Italian institutions to engage in more dialogue with young activists. This marked a significant step towards closer collaboration between generations in climate advocacy.

Responsible Consumption and Production

IULM is dedicated to establishing a sustainable campus by fostering conscientious practices among both staff and students, with the goal of attaining enduring, eco-conscious outcomes. Università IULM is actively involved in the Network of Universities for Sustainable Development (RUS), spearheaded by CRUI, the Conference of Italian University Rectors.

This initiative encourages collaboration and knowledge-sharing among all Italian universities dedicated to environmental sustainability and social responsibility.

IULM Sustainability Committee

ULM Sustainability Committee, led by the **Rector's Proxy to Sustainability and Social Responsibility**, aims to promote initiatives for listening, engagement, and education on sustainability within the IULM community (including faculty, staff, and students). It is particularly dedicated to **Responsible Consumption and Production** and tries to be as such for any activity it is involved. In fact the main measures promoted are:

- use the water bottle and water dispensers available on campus instead of plastic bottles;
- turn off the light if you are the last one to leave a room;
- don't leave faucets running in the bathroom;
- sort trash in the appropriate containers scattered around campus;
- in the cafeteria and dining halls, if you have leftover food ask to take it away, don't throw it away;
- print only if extremely necessary;
- use public transportation to get to IULM which is very well connected.

Events

Paper Week

The second edition of the paper Week was organized at IULM as a vital platform for raising awareness about the significance of **paper and cardboard recycling**. The theme of this year's festival, "Future Landscapes," offered an opportunity to explore the environmental, technological, and social aspects of the future IULM envisions and the landscapes, both tangible and metaphorical, that the university hopes to see realized. Università IULM played a pivotal role in the festival's program with an evening titled "The Future as Told by Cinema." Here, a documentary film produced by Andrea Capobianco, a IULM graduate in Television, Cinema, and News Media, examined the relationship between cinema and the understanding of the future. The film delved into how cinema has influenced and educated our perspectives on forthcoming innovations, environmental revolutions, and societal transformations, providing a unique lens through which to visualize and focus on the future. Università IULM's participation underscores its commitment to nurturing a profound understanding of the sea's significance in shaping the shared future and the pivotal role that cinema plays in helping us imagine and shape the world ahead.

Università IULM is committed to **preserving life on land and terrestrial ecosystems** as one of its core missions. Goal 15 perfectly complements the university's focus on environmental responsibility, the creation of a **sustainable campus environment**, and the education of tomorrow's leaders who grasp the intricate relationship between human actions and the well-being of Earth's terrestrial ecosystems.

In line with this mission, the **Sustainable Committee** at Università IULM actively strives to enhance awareness of sustainability on a broader scale. Additionally, the **Rector's Proxy for Sustainability and Social Responsibility** plays a pivotal role in promoting sustainable practices and initiatives within the campus community and the larger society.

CESTOur

Università IULM is a partner in the Erasmus+ project "Centers of Excellence in **Sustainable Tourism** to boost economic development and enhance University-Business cooperation in Southern Asia – CESTour". This project aims at:

- promoting sustainable tourism concepts in the tourism sector in India, Nepal, and Sri Lanka;
- enhancing university-business cooperation in the tourism sector to promote sustainable tourism development values;
- improving teaching quality and, in the long run, increase graduates' employability through training programs.

URBINAT

The URBiNAT project, driven by Università IULM, is deeply committed to safeguarding terrestrial ecosystems and the well-being of urban residents. This initiative targets the rejuvenation of urban peripheries, particularly in social housing areas across diverse cities in Europe and beyond. It emphasizes **Nature-Based Solutions (NBS)** to promote sustainability while fostering social cohesion and citizen engagement. By developing innovative NBS in public spaces and co-designing the "Healthy corridor" with local communities, the project prioritizes the physical, mental, and social well-being of city dwellers. The commitment extends to the establishment of an URBiNAT Observatory to monitor and analyze project activities, furthering the cause of life on land and terrestrial ecosystem preservation.

World Wildlife Day - Green areas at IULM

Università IULM advocates for initiatives in conservation and protection of ecosystems, such as the restoration of natural forests, wetlands, and mangroves on World Wildlife Day. The university's commitment has been further strengthened by taking charge of a new pedestrian area on Via Carlo Bo and its associated green spaces, totaling approximately 4285 square meters. This has led to a **21% increase in cared-for green areas**, marking a significant stride toward making the campus greener and enhancing the adjacent neighborhood with gardens and pedestrian areas for students and the entire city of Milan to enjoy.

Responsible water consumption

Cascina Moncucco

Cascina Moncucco, a seventeenth-century farmstead in Milan, transformation underwent an inspiring that placed conservation at the forefront of its sustainability efforts. Long neglected, this historical site was revitalized in 2017 by Università IULM, with support from various institutions, to not only preserve its historical charm but also to transform it into a residence for 100 young people and a vibrant cultural center for the city. Cascina Moncucco's commitment to water conservation was exemplified by the installation of low-flow equipment in the toilets, which significantly reduced water usage in comparison to standard buildings. Moreover, a sophisticated rainwater collection system was implemented, with a substantial 90-cubic-meter tank, allowing for the regulation of rainwater outflow and the efficient storage and reuse of rainwater for irrigating the lush green spaces, thereby minimizing the need for potable water in irrigation. Cascina Moncucco's success serves as a remarkable example of how historical restoration can align with sustainable, water-conscious practices, enriching the environment and preserving the past for a greener future.

IULM initiatives

Some of the measures adopted and implemented by the Sustainabiloty Committee are:

- distribution of free water bottles to freshmen
- installation of water dispensers throughout the university
- **communication and awareness campaigns** on water conservation (e.g. stickers in bathrooms with the words "don't leave faucets running in the bathroom")

Cascina Moncucco

Cascina Moncucco, a seventeenth-century farmstead in Milan, underwent a remarkable transformation, becoming a shining example of sustainable building standards and energy efficiency. This historical gem had long been neglected, but in 2017, Università IULM, with support from various institutions, embarked on a comprehensive renovation project. This endeavor not only breathed new life into Cascina Moncucco but also turned it into a residence for 100 young people and a cultural center for the city. The renovation project achieved **Silver** level certification with the LEED Italia 2009 NC system, signifying a deep commitment to environmental sustainability and energy conservation. The emphasis on energy efficiency was evident in improved insulation and efficient systems, while the building excelled in water conservation, boasting low-flow equipment in the toilets and a rainwater collection system for irrigation. Cascina Moncucco's success story serves as a pioneering model for similar initiatives, demonstrating how the restoration of historical treasures can go hand in hand with a greener, more energy-efficient future, all while preserving the past.
